## Southwest BACH Festival

#### Contest Rules

- Each participant entering the competitive portion of the contest must submit a copy of a proof of age document.
- Age placement is determined by the contestant's age on September 1.
- 3. All entrants must provide a copy of the music they will be performing for the judges.
- All solo music must be memorized for the contestant to be eligible for a prize or placement.
- Contestants entered in more than one category must use different repertoire for each category.
- Individual contestants in Prodigy and Open categories may enter a maximum of three of these categories with the same instrument and may not compete in individual Qualified categories.
- Individual Qualified category participants may not enter the Prodigy or Open Categories.
- Ensembles entered in Open ensemble categories may not compete in Qualified Ensemble categories.
- Ensembles entered in Qualified ensemble categories may not compete in Open Ensemble categories.
- Entry in Novelty Solo, Novelty Ensemble, and Essay categories is unrestricted by participation in other categories.
- 11. Entrants must supply their own accompanists.
- 12. Duet and ensemble players may not compete more than once in the same category.
- 13. Duet and ensemble age categories are based on the age of the eldest member.
- First place winners may not re-enter the same or a lower category the year following their first place win.
- Decisions of the judges are final.
- 16. Contact between the judges and contestants, teachers and parents is prohibited before, during and after the contest. Participants must be present at the awards ceremony to receive their awards. Awards left unclaimed at the awards ceremony will be offered to the next runner up in that category.
- Trophies will be awarded for first through fourth place in each category and age group.
- 18. Scheduling of competing participants is selected at random.
- 19. Entry forms should be submitted by September 15 of the year.
- 20. Late entries may be accommodated for an additional \$10 processing fee per category.
- If less than 3 contestants enroll in a particular category age group, that section may be discontinued and the contestants entered in a comparable category.
- 22. Since there is no membership fee involved we are not sending any entry information. Contest schedules and results will post online at: swbachfestival.org/contest. Sorry that we are not apple to change schedules by request.

#### Definitions of Evaluation Criteria

Technical - Grades in the Technical area gage the quality of the **performer**, expressing the level of foundational technical ability and physical skills.

Technique: Evaluation of physical dexterity on the fingerboard and with the bow. Adjudicators are looking for physical strength,

endurance, proper hand positions, posture, and accuracy.

Tone: Evaluation of tone quality and pitch accuracy (playing in tune). Adjudicators are looking for a good full sound played with

confidence and maturity, and proper pitch intonation within the instrument as well as pitch agreement with the accompanist.

Performance - Grades in the Performance area represent elements of that specific performance.

Accuracy: Specific mistakes are noted as negative error points and keyed to bars in the music. Error points are valued according to

severity. The error point total is subtracted from the final grade. Wrongs notes, inaccuracies of rhythm and incorrect intoration may earn subtractive points.

Dynamics: Evaluation of musicality and accurate observation of written dynamics. Sensitivity and emotion are graded along with the performer's accurate reading of written dynamics.

Stage Presence: Evaluation of the performer's poise, showmanship, a n d relationship to the audience. The performer's attitude is

evaluated along with the student's ability to engage the audience in the musical experience.

Quality: Evaluation of the overall quality of the listening experience.

Repertoire - Grades in the Repertoire area rate considerations of the musical selection.

Demand: A rating of the difficulty of the written music.

Tempo: A rating of the speed and rhythmic demands of the music and the performer's adherence to written tempos.

**Special Consideration**: Bonus points are awarded for performing a b o ve and beyond normal or reasonable expectations. This may

include but is not limited to overcoming distractions or difficulties of the performing situation, or if a performer selects and performs well a piece of music normally reserved for a more experienced player.
